Universities Fighting World Hunger is a global higher education movement focused on educating, mobilizing, and organizing students, administrators and faculty in the war against hunger. The innovative model was launched by Auburn University in 2004 in partnership with the UN World Food Programme (WFP). The movement has involved nearly 300 universities worldwide.

HOW IT WORKS

Each school in the network plans its own agenda using the UFWH model. The UFWH model encourages students to become leaders in the fight against hunger through the following activities:

1. Raising awareness about hunger on campus and in the community
2. Fundraising for local food banks or other organizations
3. Becoming an advocate for the hungry
4. Getting involved in related academic initiatives (coursework, research, etc.)
5. Attending UFWH annual summits
