The Involvement Awards will recognize deserving student organizations and individuals for their accomplishments during the 2018-2019 academic year.

Nominations can be submitted by any Auburn University student, faculty, or staff member. In order to complete a nomination, individuals may access the nomination form [here](#) starting on **Monday, January 14, 2019 at 8:00 AM**. All nominations are due by **Friday, February 15, 2019 at 12:00 AM**.

Award winners will be selected by a distinguished selection committee consisting of Auburn University administration, faculty, staff, and prominent student leaders. Organization leaders and advisors will be invited to attend the Involvement Awards celebration.

Involvement Awards Nomination Tips

1. **Start the nomination form early!** Starting the nomination form early allows you plenty of time to make edits, add new information, or upload pictures of your nominee doing amazing things around campus!
2. **Attach a picture of the individual and/or organization you are nominating.** Adding pictures, documents, and even video clips to your nomination form helps the selection committee see your nominee in action and can highlight some of the events you may be describing in the form.
3. **Be detailed!** The more detailed you are on your nomination form the better! Our judges can only take what is written on your nomination form into consideration when giving their scores. As a result, the more detailed your responses are the better idea the judges will have about the organization's/individual's success.
4. **Attach a picture of the organization's logo** (if applicable).

5. **Plan to submit the nomination form *before* the deadline.** Submitting your nomination form *before* the deadline will eliminate any potential “last minute stress”. This will also give you enough time to contact Student Involvement if any issues should occur with plenty of time to spare.

Please Note-

- “SAP” organizations include *Alternative Student Breaks (ASB), Auburn University Dance Marathon (AUDM), Beat Bama Food Drive (BBFD), Spring Up, Emerge At Auburn, The Institute By Leadershape, IMPACT, The Big Event, Involvement Ambassadors, Organizations Board, Black Student Union (BSU), International Student Organization (ISO), Student Government Association (SGA), Welcome Week, University Program Council (UPC), WEGL 91.1, The Auburn Plainsman, Auburn Circle, Eagle Eye TV, and the Glomerata.*
- “NON-SAP” organizations refer to all other registered student organizations.

Most Exceptional Campus Organization (SAP ONLY)

Given to the SAP organization that most exemplifies the traits of an Auburn organization and best develops its members into Auburn men and women. Must be a Student Activities Portfolio (SAP) to apply.

Most Exceptional Campus Organization (NON-SAP ONLY)

Given to the Non-SAP organization that most exemplifies the traits of an Auburn organization and best develops its members into Auburn men and women. Students Activity Portfolio (SAP) 's may not apply.

Overcoming Adversity Award

Given to the organization that has both encountered and overcome substantial difficulties in its operation.

The Fred & Charlene Kam “Human Touch” Service Award

Given to the organization whose philanthropic and/or community service activities exemplify the power of the “Human Touch.”

Student Leader of the Year

Given to the student who best demonstrates exceptional leadership abilities.

The Corey Edwards Organization Advisor of the Year Award

Given to the organization advisor who has exceeded his or her obligations in the support of a student organization and the students within that organization.

Outstanding New Organization

Given to the first year organization that most exemplifies the traits of an Auburn organization and best develops its members into Auburn men and women.

Most Entertaining Campus Event

Given to the host organization of the event that most enjoyably promotes student involvement through entertainment.

Outstanding Cultural Impact

Given to the organization that best shares and promotes culture, resulting in a more educated student population.

Excellence in Marketing and Design (SAP ONLY)

Given to the SAP organization with the highest quality of marketing & design techniques. Based on aesthetics, outreach, & originality. Must be a Student Activities Portfolio (SAP) to apply.

Excellence in Marketing and Design (NON-SAP ONLY)

Given to the Non- SAP organization with the highest quality of marketing & design techniques. Based on aesthetics, outreach, & originality. Students Activity Portfolio (SAP) 's may not apply.

Excellence in Practical Application

Given to the individual or organization whose higher understanding of skills learned in coursework is demonstrated through the organizations accomplishments.

Outstanding Incorporation of Diversity & Inclusion

Given to the organization that best promotes diversity and inclusion within and outside of its members.
