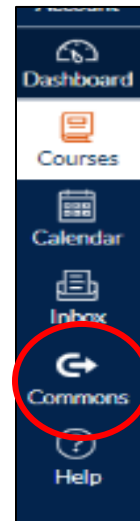
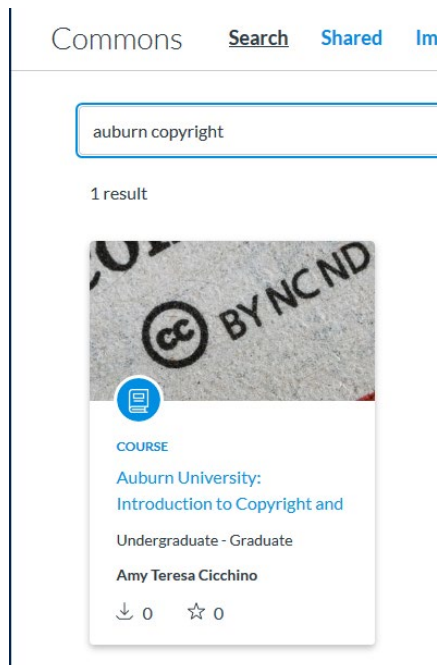


HOW TO DOWNLOAD A RESOURCE FROM THE AUBURN COMMONS

1. On your Canvas Dashboard, select “Commons” from the left-hand side of the screen. If this is your first time using the Commons, you will be asked to give Canvas Commons permission to access your profile.

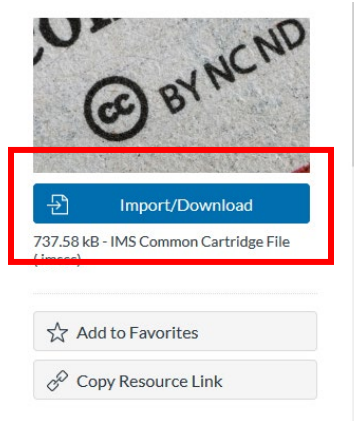


2. Type “Auburn” and “Copyright” into the Commons Search bar and locate the “ePortfolio Orientation” course (pictured below)

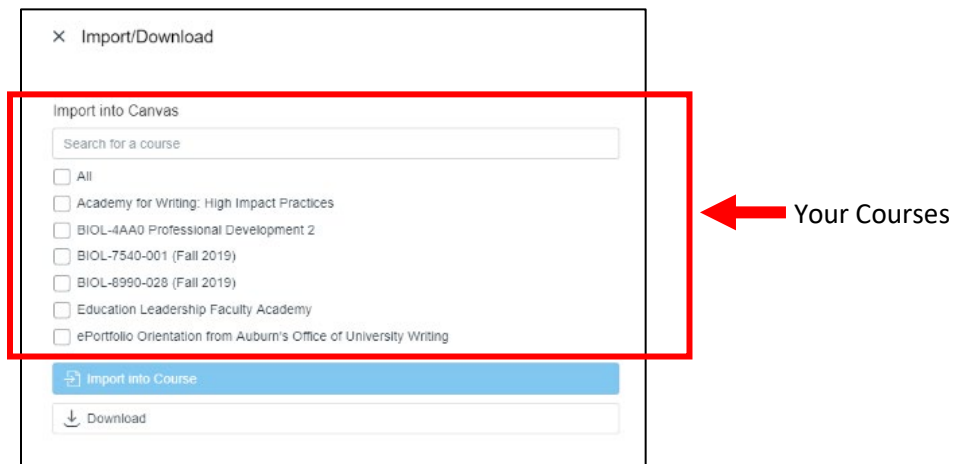


HOW TO DOWNLOAD A RESOURCE FROM THE AUBURN COMMONS

- Click on the course title, allow time for loading, and select “Import/Download” located on the right-hand side of the screen.











- When you select “Import/Download,” a new screen will appear. Select the course to which you want to add the ePortfolio Orientation.



- After selecting the appropriate course(s), click on “Import into Course.” This may take a few minutes.
